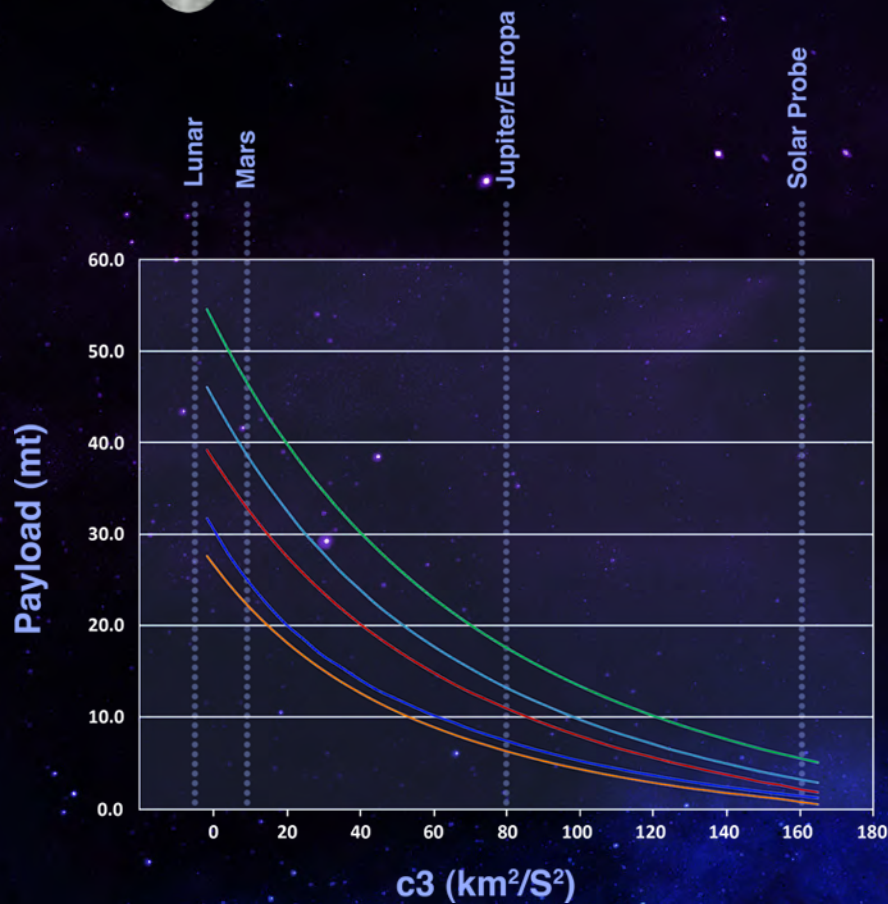
- NASA's Space Launch System (SLS) will be the most powerful rocket ever built.

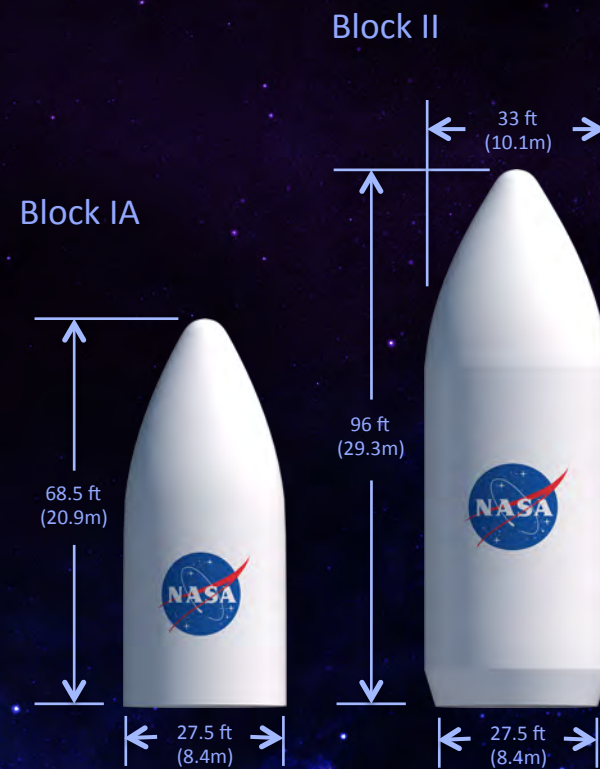


Vehicle Configurations

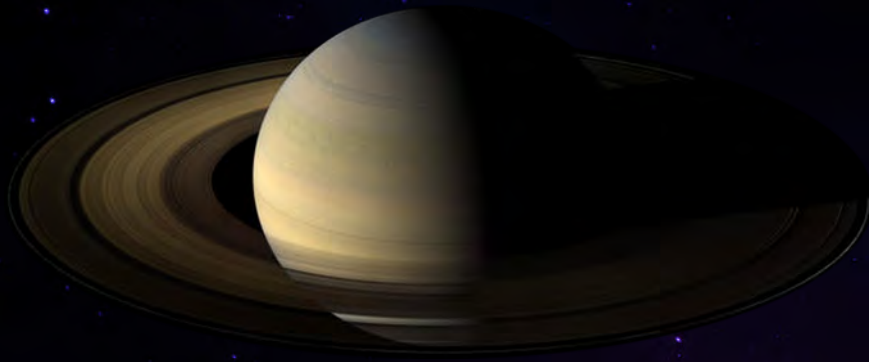
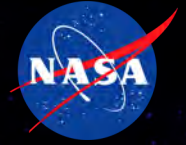


Mission Performance
