On 4 October 2010 a corner wall in a waste water retaining pond broke releasing a torrent of toxic sludge

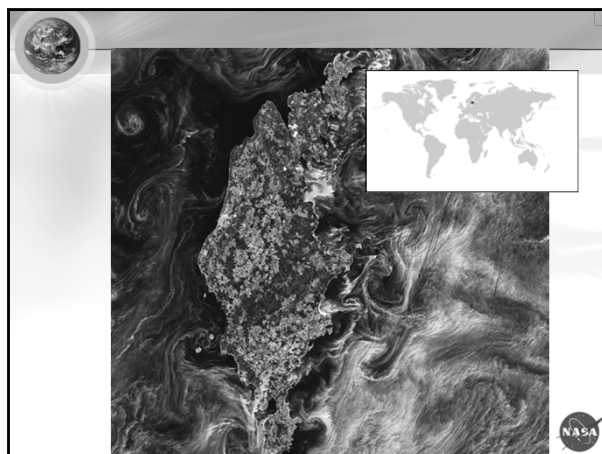
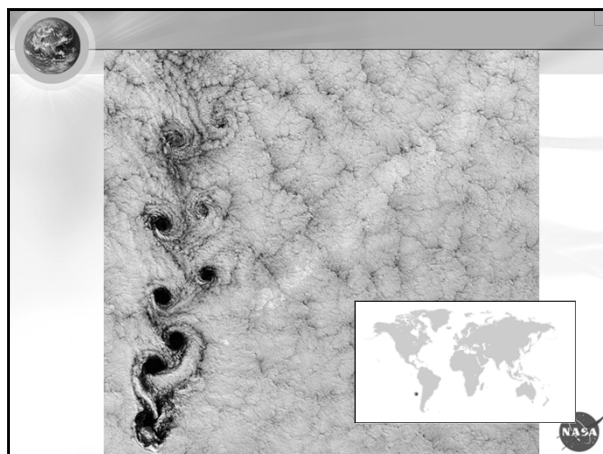
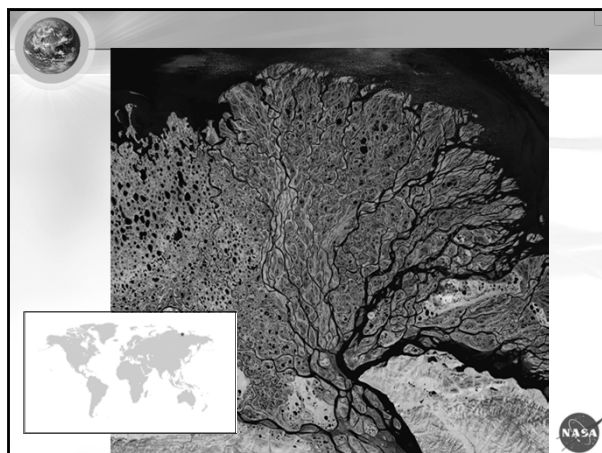
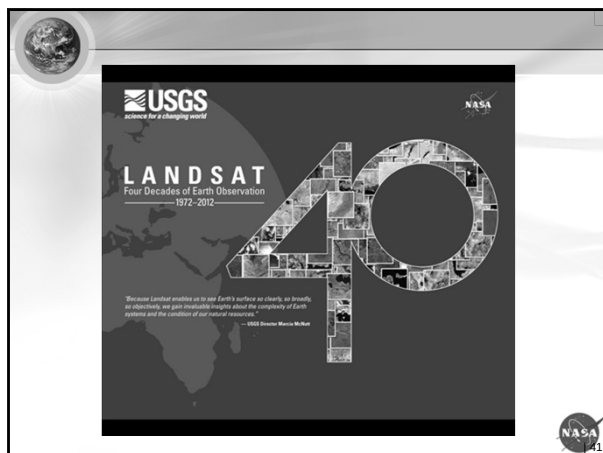
